It's estimated that 7.1 million adults in England take prescribed opioid or gabapentinoid pain medication¹.

The number of prescriptions in England and Wales for opioid pain medications has risen dramatically from more than 14 million in 2008 to 23 million in 2018² – with the North East being the biggest culprit³.

Across County Durham over **55,000 prescriptions** for opioids and gabapentinoids are dispensed every month, with an estimated 8,000 patients a month on a risky combination of the two classes⁴.
